Care Inspection

Abertay's Sheltered Service was inspected on the 24th March 2016, where the inspection looked at three main areas. The Care Inspectorate grades range from 1-6 one being poor and six excellent.

The three main areas were graded as follows.

Quality of care and support - 6

Quality of staffing - 5

Quality of leadership and management - 5

Abertay's grading was very good to excellent, which is our best ever grading, and the highest grades of any Sheltered Service in Dundee. A big congratulations to staff and tenants from all our Sheltered Service.
